Must meet one or more of the following based on the number of points for which you are applying

Increase the number of activities and activity areas

Meet enhanced space

Meet enhanced staff child ratios

Score at least 4.0 or higher on an environment rating scale assessment




To earn more than one point:

The administrator and at least 75% of lead teachers must have completed their $\, \underline{\text{credential requirements}} \,$











Shortage of Child Care Teachers & Teacher Assistants

- Child Care Facilities have vacant classrooms because they cannot hire qualified staff.






School Enrollment Percent of Change 2012-2019










































































As of June 2019, there were 4,073 people looking for work compared to 5,152 job openings.
