






























Role of School Nurse

















































2016 Needs Assessment Survey Dental Data

Out of 802 respondents that had difficulty receiving health services, there were 36.5% that reported that they had difficulty receiving preventative dental services (ex. Checkups, getting teeth cleaned) due to financial constraints.

Among those who reported having difficulty accessing health services (699 respondents), 67.8% reported that dental services as being difficult to access.

Proposed Rule to Increase Dental Care Access

Public health hygienists who practice in rest homes, public schools, long-term care facilities, nursing homes, and rural and community clinics operated by federal, state, county, or local governments in areas identified as dental access shortage areas may:

- Perform clinical hygiene procedures under the direction of a dentist based on a written standing order, rather an in-person evaluation by the dentist.
- Supervise a dental assistant who assists the public health hygienist
