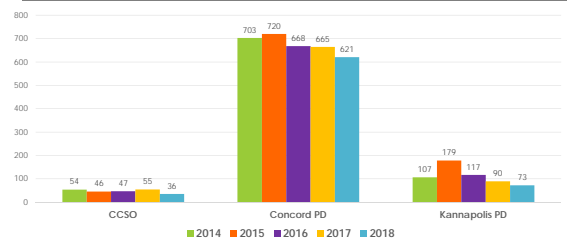
Property Crimes in North Carolina 2008 to 2017

Raise the Age

S.L. 2017-57 (S 257) – Juvenile Justice Reinvestment Act

The Juvenile Justice Reinvestment Act, included in the 2017 state budget, increases the age of juvenile court jurisdiction to include crimes committed by 16 and 17-year-olds, except for motor vehicle offenses, and expedites transfer to adult court for 16 and 17-year-olds who commit Class A-G felonies. The Act also makes several other changes to the Juvenile Code, which are summarized below.

Definitions

(effective December 1, 2019, and applicable to offenses committed on or after that date)

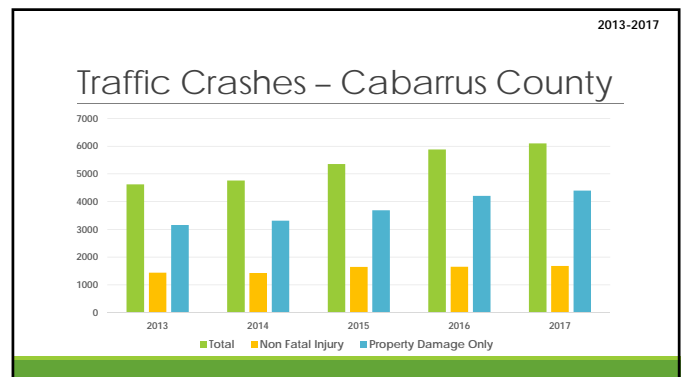
Delinquent Juvenile – As defined by amended G.S. 7B-1501(7) and amended G.S. 143B-805(6), the term “delinquent juvenile” includes 16 and 17-year-olds who commit crimes or infractions, excluding motor vehicle offenses, or indirect contempt by a juvenile as defined by G.S. 5A-31. Amended G.S. 143B-805(6) also includes indirect contempt by a juvenile as a delinquent offense for juveniles who are under 16, consistent with G.S. 7B-1501(7).

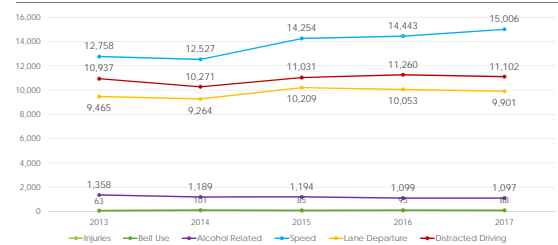

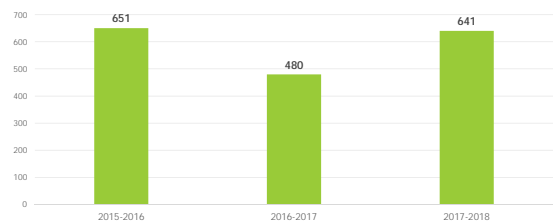
Domestic Violence and Sexual Assault Data Background

The NC Council for Women and Youth Involvement (NCCFWYI) requires each state-funded domestic violence (DV) and sexual assault (SA) grantee to report semi-annually on client service provision. NCCFWYI compiles the statistical data for DV and SA services utilized by women, men, and children seeking support, information, counseling and advocacy. NCCFWYI monitors the delivery of services and produces the only county-level data on client services in North Carolina.

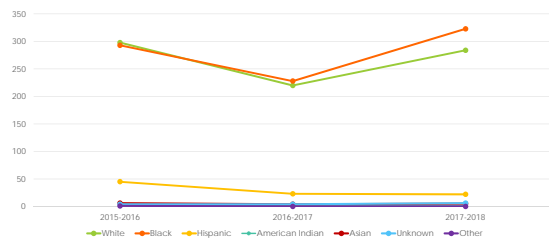
This data will not directly reflect the criminal justice system data that involves cases of domestic violence or sexual assault.

Domestic Violence Clients Served

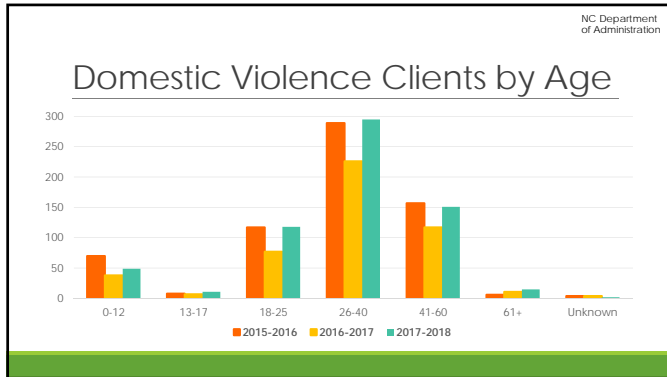


Domestic Violence Clients Served by Race



% of DV Client by Race vs. % of Population

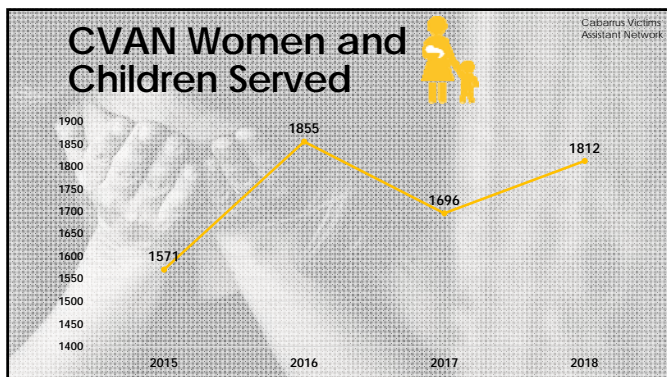

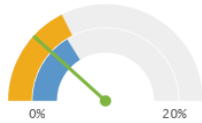


Percent in Poverty by Race

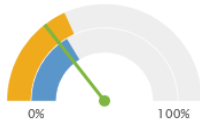
Percent Population with Income at or Below 50% FPL

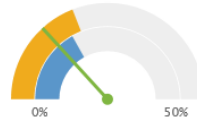

Children in Poverty

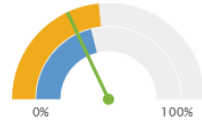
Percent Population Under Age 18 in Poverty

Percent Population Under Age 18 at or Below 200% FPL



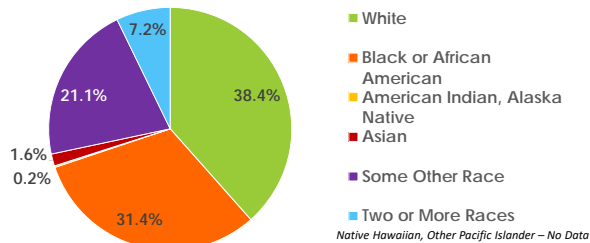

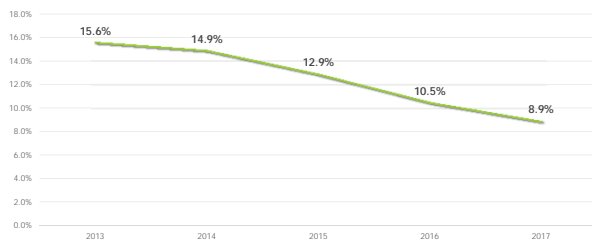
